The Palace

Palazzo Te is the masterpiece of Giulio Romano in Mantua. It was built and decorated between 1525 and 1535 as a place for "honest leisure" of the owner, Federico II Gonzaga. Generally inspired by the ancient Roman villa, and although it has immediately undergone to the restoration over the centuries, it is considered as one of the most valuable and better conserved Renaissance architectures. The talent of Giulio had made it possible to integrate the culture of period of Raffaello and Michelangelo, while leaving the evidence of his deep knowledge in the classical tradition, which had created the unsual and surprising inventions. The visitors will be accompanied by the strong emotions on this rich and varied journey; from the Courtyuard of Honor to the Hall of the Horses, from the Chamber of Amor and Psyche, to those of the Winds and Eagles, from the precious Chamber of Stuccoes to the tumultuous Chamber of the Giants.

The Museum

The upper floor of the palace presents the significant collection of documentary andd artistic interests.

The "Arnoldo Mondadori" Donation exhibits works by Federico Zandomeneghi and Armando Spadini, who were the leading painters of the 19th and 20th centuries.

The "Ugo Sissa" Mesopotamian Collection is one of the rare collections in Italy. There are about 250 artifacts related to the ancient civilizations developed between the Tigris and Euphrates. The Gonzagan Section collects the weights and measures in bronze which were used in the ancient state of Gonzaga, and also dies, punches, medals and coins of Mantua and its surrounding area. The Egyptian Collection, collected by a Mantuan Giuseppe Acerbi, includes sculptures in marble, bronze and wood, as well as many objects related to rituals of funerals and worship of the gods.



Palazzo San Sebastiano

The Palace

The Palace was built between 1506 and 1508 by the order of Lord Francesco II Gonzaga, the husband of Isabella d'Este, in order to ensure a private space near the island of the Te for the relaxation and pleasure, and to offer an adequate venue for the masterpiece of Andrea Mantegna: The Triumphs of Caesar. The elengant Loggia of the Marbles, the Chambers of the Hedgehog, of the Crucible, of the Sun are all located on the ground floor; and those of the Arrows and of Brevi are at the first floor. Along with other richly decorated rooms, they reflect the glory of ancient times. The rooms have the homogeneous ornamental installation with a precise physiognomy. At the center of each vault, an emblem is dipicted. This represents the name of each room. For example, a dense shower of little flames, a cascade of arrows and countless amount of strips of papers. They will please the visitors' eyes with the unexpected surprise and charm.


The Museum

The City Museum offers a historic and artistic collection, which is organized into seven thematic sections with support in multimedia. It introduces significant moments in the history of Mantua, with the works mainly related to Gonzaga. The City and the Water section compiles the sculptures and gravestones that document the city's relationship with water. In the Emblematic Aristocracy section, the heraldic insignia of the Gonzaga and other noble families in Mantua are exposed. The City of the Prince documents the Renaissance city through the architectural remains. The Cult of the Ancient and The Rebirth of the Ancient present ancient works of the Renaissance period, which belonged to the Gonzaga. The Triumphs of Mantegna exhibits the facsimiles of 17th century fresco. Examples of Paintings in Mantua between 15th and 16th century section bringts together the paintings by artists who were influenced by Mantegna.
